DROPPING OFF STUDENTS IN MONIVAE COLLEGE GROUNDS

Year 7 2008

Enrolment applications for next year's Year 7 (2008) have already begun to flow rapidly. Due to the increasing number of applications received each year for Year 7, we have introduced an initial cut-off date for 2008 Year 7 enrolments on **Friday March 16**. All applications received up until this date will result in an enrolment interview being offered. After the interviews have been completed up to 100 places will be offered. Applications received after March 16th will be placed on a waiting list. Please note that the number of applications in the previous two years have exceeded the number of places available and we expect the same to be the case again for 2008, so it is most important that the timeline of March 16th is met.

Those applicants for Year 7 (2008) who are also applying for one of the limited number of scholarships should note that the closing date for scholarship applications is also March 16th. For further information, please contact the Registrar, Mrs Dianne Taylor.

SCHOOL START BONUS

The Victorian Government is delivering a School Start Bonus of \$300 to parents or carers of all students enrolled for the first time in Prep or Year 7 for 2007.

This bonus will help parent or carers meet the extra education costs associated with a child starting in Prep or Year 7, including uniforms, school bags and other equipment.

The \$300 School Start Bonus will be paid by cheque. This will be mailed to the address of the person registered with the school as the primary carer from mid February once enrolment details have been confirmed.

A message to Parents/ Guardians and Students from the Health & Physical Education Faculty

Welcome back to all students and their families as we commence another academic year!! The Health and Physical Education faculty believe participation in practical lessons is of the utmost importance and is critical to the successful completion of all Physical Education units from Years 7-12. Included are our expectations for participation and a summary of the Physical Education uniform policy for all Year 7 students and other new students. (This uniform policy is also printed in student planners). It is also a good reminder to returning families.

Participation Policy

- Students must participate in a minimum of 90% of practical lessons
- If students are injured or unwell or have incorrect uniform items, a note must be written, dated and signed by a parent/ guardian and handed to the Physical Education teacher.
- If students fail to bring their correct Physical Education uniform on 3 occasions during a semester without a note during the term, the School Co-ordinators will be notified, then a phone call will be made to parents/ guardians to notify them of this.
- If a student fails to bring their correct Physical Education uniform a 4th time, this may result in them failing the unit. Failure of Junior or Middle School PE Units may jeopardise a student's subject choice in future VCE years.

Anti-perspirants may be used in P.E. classes but only the roll-on variety are allowed. NO aerosol cans are to be brought to school, as these pose a serious health and safety risk to asthmatic students.

Correct Physical Education Uniform: (See student planner for photographs)

- * Polo Shirt – Light Blue with Monivae emblem (Please note: Representative t-shirts such as Waverley International Netball and National Schools Basketball are NOT to be worn in Physical Education classes.)
- * Shorts - Navy Basketball/ Plain Navy Shorts (No stripes or other colours)
- * White Sports Socks
- * Sandshoes
- * Trackpants - Navy 'Monivae' pants
- * Monivae Sports Jumper/Spicer (Optional)

Students are NOT to wear their Monivae Sports Uniform to school for Physical Education classes Period One. The only reason for wearing the Sports Uniform to school would be if a student is representing Monivae in a sporting activity such as GSSSA Swimming or Athletics etc.

Students MUST be changed after Physical Education classes at the end of the day (Period Four). The only students who may stay in their Sports Uniform are:

- * Boarders (Who reside at the College)
- * Students who have Monivae sports training/ practice after school: Eg: Saturday Morning Netball or Hockey Monivae

training. This does not include Tuesday Hamilton Junior Tennis or other non-school related sports.

IMPORTANT TERM ONE INFORMATION

During Term 1, all students are requested to bring appropriate bathers (One or two piece, but no string or Triangle top bikinis) and a towel (goggles are optional) as well as the normal Physical Education uniform. Weather permitting students may participate in swimming at our Monivae pool or alternate activities.

Students will be permitted to wear T-shirts or board shorts over their bathers if they would feel more comfortable.

For new students to Monivae, it is a good idea to bring your PE Sports Uniform to school at the start of each week and store it in your locker for when you have Phys Ed. This will ensure if you forget to bring your PE uniform for your timetabled lesson, it will be in your locker.

EDUCATION MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE

The Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is provided to assist eligible families with the costs associated with the education of their children. To be eligible for receipt of the EMA you must:

- * be either a parent or guardian of a primary or secondary school student up to the age of sixteen; **and**
- * be an eligible beneficiary of a Centrelink pension, allowance or benefit within the meaning of the State * Concessions Act 2004 **or** be a Veterans Affairs (TPI) pensioner **or** be a foster parent.

The eligibility criteria must be met as at the first day of Term 1 (30 January 2007) and Term 3 (16 July 2007).

The EMA application must be submitted to the school by **28 February 2007** for the first payment and **3 August 2007** for the second payment.

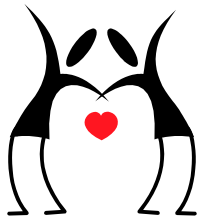
The EMA provides an annual amount of **\$210** for primary students and **\$420** for secondary students and is paid in two instalments.

Parents with continuing eligibility, who are paid the first instalment of 2007 through this school will not be required to complete a new application for the second instalment. Parents who transfer children to another school after 28 February 2007 and prior to or on 3 August 2007, must re-apply at the new school for the second instalment.

Application forms are available from the school office.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

A "Conveyance Allowance" is available from the Education Department for students who live more than 4.8 kilometres from their school or bus stop. This allowance covers private car travel, private bus travel and public transport.

The criteria for eligibility for the Conveyance Allowance is as follows. Students must live more than 4.8 km by the **shortest practicable route** from the **nearest** school attended and be enrolled at the nearest government primary or secondary school, or at the **nearest appropriate** registered non-government school.

The application for the Car Allowance (Yellow form) must be filled out for each eligible student, with additional students travelling in the same car listed on the form. The formula for payment for this allowance is based on distance from home to the government bus stop, public transport bus stop or directly to school.

If you have not received a form and consider that you are eligible for the Conveyance Allowance please contact the school and a form will be sent out. Forms **MUST** be accompanied by proof of distance travelled (town map or fire map) indicating the route travelled from home to school or home to the nearest government bus stop or public transport stop.

The application for Private Bus Travel allowance (eg. Monivae College's Portland Bus service) is required to be filled out on a different form (Pink Form) to private car allowance. As the formula for payment for this allowance is also based on distance from the school it is essential that the form is filled out accurately. One application per student is required for this allowance. Parents cannot claim both private car and private bus allowances.

Parents who have students travelling on Public Transport (eg. Neale Guthrie's Casterton Bus Service) will need to complete a different form again (Green Form.) The formula for reimbursement of Public Transport travel is 100% of the cost. One application per student is required for this allowance.

Please note: Parents qualifying for both private car travel and Public Transport Travel will be required to fill in the car application form and the public transport bus application form.

If you have previously submitted a Conveyance Allowance Form and have not changed your circumstances, a new form is NOT required.

MATHEMATICS

Graphic Calculators

The use of graphic calculators forms an important part of VCE Mathematics. It is assumed that students have a graphic calculator in most Year 12 exams.

It is strongly recommended that all students studying VCE Mathematics have access to a graphic calculator. Year 10 students intending to study Mathematics at both Year 11 and 12 should purchase their own. These calculators can be taken to university and used for further study. Provision will be made for students who are unable to purchase their own for use in examinations.

To enable effective use of these calculators it is very important that all students at Monivae College have the same model calculator as each model works differently. The calculators required are:

Year 11
VCAL Numeracy, Scientific calculator

General Mathematics (Further), Scientific Calculator or graphic calculator, (TI 84 plus or TI 83 plus)
Mathematical Methods (CAS), TI 89 Titanium CAS calculator

Year 12
Further Mathematics,
Mathematical Methods
Continue to use graphic calculators from 2006
Specialist Mathematics

Any Year 11 or 12 student who needs to purchase a graphic calculator can use the attached order form. Please fill in and return the form and cheque or credit card details to **Abacus** by 2nd February 2007. **Please make sure you circle the correct calculator. Check with me if there is any confusion.**
The calculators will be delivered to Monivae College.

Please make sure that graphic and scientific calculators are engraved with your son or daughter's name. Also students should keep any documentation, cables, CDs and instruction books that come with the calculator in a safe place so these items can be found easily when they are needed.

Satisfactory completion of units at all Year Levels

There are three aspects to satisfactory completion of Mathematics. These are:
Attendance in class
Completion of classwork
Completion and submission of assessment tasks

To gain an S at the end of the unit, students must have completed each of these satisfactorily.

It is expected that all students bring their CAS or graphic or scientific calculator, their text book and other items as listed on the stationery list to every Maths class.
